The bustling city of Hong Kong was just a collection of fishing villages when claimed by Britain in 1842 following the First Opium War with China. That's a far cry from the bustling and modern metropolis which it is now. Under the unique principle of 'One Country, Two Systems', Hong Kong returned to Chinese sovereignty on 1 July 1997 as a Special Administrative Region (SAR) of the People's Republic of China. This arrangement allows Hong Kong to enjoy a high degree of autonomy, retaining its capitalist system, independent judiciary and rule of law, free trade and freedom of speech.

Hong Kong's magnificent harbor has been the key to its development as a trading port and entrepôt for China, progressing through an industrial era to become a leading financial and services centre in Asia. The unique blend of eastern and western influences matched by diverse attractions and stunning countryside has also made Hong Kong Asia's prime tourist destination.

## Getting There

Hong Kong International Airport (HKIA) is located less than five flying hours from half of the world's population. With some 750 flights every day and approximately 90 airlines operating, HKIA links Hong Kong with approximately 150 destinations round the world, including some 40 cities on the Chinese Mainland.

## Ground Transportation (to and from the airport)

Getting to and from Hong Kong International Airport is easy, convenient and relatively inexpensive, with numerous options available.

**Taxi**—Taxis are readily available from the taxi pick-up area in front of the Arrivals Hall. Take a red taxi unless travelling only to Lantau (blue) or the New Territories (green). All taxis can go to and from the airport. Fares are metered and details of fares and extra charges are clearly displayed inside each cab.

**Train**—The Mass Transit Railway's (MTR) high-speed Airport Express takes approximately 24 minutes to Hong Kong Island and is the fastest transport link to the airport. Airport Express passengers can take a free shuttle bus from Kowloon station to major hotels. Both these stations provide free in-town check-in services for major airlines.

## General Information

Hong Kong is situated on the southeastern coast of China and covers an area of 1,104 square kilometers (425 square miles). It is comprised of Hong Kong Island, Kowloon and the New Territories, which includes 262 outlying islands. Population is more than 7 million. Electricity is 220V/50Hz UK plug. The Time Zone is GMT +8. International Calling Code: Dial +852 to call a Hong Kong number from overseas. There are no regional codes.

Cantonese is the Chinese dialect spoken by over 88-percent of the people in Hong Kong. However, English is widely used in the Government and by the legal, professional and business sectors, as well as tourist areas. Most taxi drivers and salespeople are able to communicate in English.

## Getting Around in Hong Kong

Hong Kong is geographically compact and boasts one of the world's most efficient, safe, affordable and frequent public transport systems. Whether by taxi, ferry, rail, bus or tram, you can get around easily and catch wonderful glimpses of the city along the way.

For convenience, use an Octopus Card, an electronic stored-value card that is accepted on most public transport, and at many fast food chains and stores. It's easy and convenient to use, saves time and eliminates the need for small change.

## Things to Do & See

Discover the myriad things to see and do in one of the most diverse and exciting destinations in the world. Hong Kong offers a host of memorable tourist attractions within its compact area, with The Peak, Victoria Harbour and the Giant Buddha among the most awe-inspiring.

## Shopping

From glitzy malls to funky street markets, and trendy boutiques to traditional Chinese product stores and themed shopping districts, one can find everything from the latest designer fashions and electronic gadgets to best-value antiques and collectibles. ## Weather

May in Hong Kong sees temperatures and humidity rising. Evenings can be cool. Average temperature Highs are 28.5° C (83° F) with Lows of 24° C (75° F).

## Money Matters

**Currency**—The legal tender is the Hong Kong dollar (HK\$), which is linked to the US dollar at a rate of about 7.80 HKD to 1 USD, although exchange rates may fluctuate slightly. Chinese currency (RMB or Yuan) is also accepted many places.

## Credit Cards & Traveler's Checks

Traveller's cheques are accepted by leading banks and hotels. International credit cards such as American Express, VISA, Diners Club and MasterCard are also widely acceptable at hotels, retail shops and restaurants. Such premises usually display stickers of accepted cards at their entrance.

**ATM's**—Automated teller machines (ATMs) can be found almost everywhere and some HSBC 'Electronic Money' machines provide 24-hour cash withdrawal (HK\$) facilities for Visa and MasterCard holders. American Express cardholders have access to 'Aeon' ATMs and can withdraw local currency with Express Cash service in town.

**Tipping**—Most restaurants will levy a 10-percent service charge but waiters will expect to be given some loose change. Restaurants that don't add a service charge will expect a 10-percent tip. However, tipping is left to your discretion. Bellboys, porters, restroom attendants and taxi drivers are happy to accept loose change.
